

District council meeting of 30 March 2022

Convened and announced on 24 March 2022

1. Determination of venue for the district council meeting

The district council unanimously approved the Cultural Centre “an Henkes” in Contern as the venue for this district council meeting.

2. HR matters

In closed session.

3. Approval of three cost estimates

The Mayor explained why the parking spaces as currently configured near the school presented several hazards simultaneously. Parents were reversing out, and it was easy not to spot children when doing so. Children also run along the side between cars arriving and leaving, which means a lack of visibility for everyone involved. A Kiss & Go drop-off area at the Um Ewent school campus was therefore urgently needed. The edges of the kerbs were being raised, and a lane was being created parallel to the kerb, allowing children to get out safely and no longer needing to run around parking cars.

In addition, rebuilding the bus stop in the front area of the Um Ewent school campus will ensure greater safety. The kerb was being raised significantly, and more space was being provided for the individual buses.

Lastly, construction of a raised zone in the Rue de Syren, at the bus entrance to the Um Ewent school campus, was presented. This demonstrably calms traffic and therefore prevents accidents.

The Council voted unanimously to approve the three cost estimates.

4. Approval of income

The Council unanimously approved income of € 958,015.63 for 2021 and € 22,636.19 for 2022.

5. Announcements and councillor questions

The Mayor announced that a traffic concept was being implemented in the Rue de Luxembourg which had been developed by a planning office. Their experience was relied on, but now the Cabinet nevertheless wanted to respond to the recent accidents and will provide extensive islands as a border to the obstacles to guide car drivers safely past them. In addition, in some places a central line will be marked, which drivers can use as a guide. The carriageway markings will be given a relief, so that even inattentive drivers remain in their lane.

The Mayor reported, in connection with the refugees from the Ukraine, that the solidarity and the willingness of volunteers to help were undiminished. It was wonderful to see how much support is being offered to that community. Due to delays in repairing the warehouse building in Weiergewan, people will remain in the Cultural Centre in Moutfort for the time being.

Jean-Pierre Di Genova brought up the invitation to SIGI's 40-year celebration, and invited all members of the District Council to attend this event.
